



The Impact of FMAP Funding: 10th Congressional District of Pennsylvania

Bradford, Lackawanna, Luzerne, Lycoming, Montour, Northumberland, Pike,
Snyder, Sullivan, Susquehanna, Tioga, Union, Wayne and Wyoming Counties

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Medical Assistance (Medicaid) Impacts within District

- **At least 1 in 3 children rely on Medical Assistance for health care in Bradford, Lackawanna, Luzerne, Northumberland, Susquehanna, Tioga, Wayne and Wyoming Counties.**
- For the counties in this district, **there are a total of 196,604 individuals who rely on Medicaid for health care.**
- In Pennsylvania, **every dollar spent in Pennsylvania's Medicaid program generates \$2.77 in economic activity in local communities** through the purchase of needed goods and services (Source: Families USA). As a result, **Pennsylvania's Medicaid program had an economic impact of \$3.7 billion within the counties located in this congressional district**, with each county's impact listed below.
 - Bradford – \$158 million
 - Lackawanna – \$ 906 million
 - Luzerne – \$1.1 billion
 - Lycoming – \$319 million
 - Montour – \$236 million
 - Northumberland – \$240 million
 - Pike – \$58 million
 - Snyder – \$252 million
 - Sullivan – \$33 million
 - Susquehanna – \$66 million
 - Tioga – \$85 million
 - Union – \$101 million
 - Wayne – \$127 million
 - Wyoming – \$52 million
- **Pennsylvania's budget for Medical Assistance for 2010-11, which includes the FMAP extension, will support an estimated 218,000 jobs in Pennsylvania** (Source: Families USA) in the health care sector (nursing homes, hospitals, home health care agencies, etc.).
- Every million dollars cut from health investments in Pennsylvania's Medicaid budget will result in a loss of \$2.7 million in economic activity in Pennsylvania.



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Failure to Extend FMAP Could Impact Human Services and Individuals in each PA County

Failure to extend the FMAP rate will result in the state needing to find other dollars to help balance the budget. Such action could impact human services programs in the counties. Below is a table of the numbers of individuals receiving services from human services programs during fiscal year 2008-09.
